Background:

In April 2019, the province of Ontario launched the Community Housing Renewal Strategy. The Strategy sets broad direction to sustain, repair and grow Ontario's community housing system and outlines the government's approach to preserving Ontario's community housing assets.

To complement the Strategy, the Ministry of Municipal Affairs and Housing has developed a

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technical backgrounder on the end of operating agreements and mortgages as a resource for Service Managers and housing providers.

This backgrounder is intended to provide community housing providers and Service Managers with a better understanding of what happens at the end of a housing project's operating agreement and/or mortgage. It is not intended to provide analysis on the impacts that the end of operating agreements and mortgages might have on housing providers or Service Managers.

The ministry is working in partnership with Service Managers, housing providers and community housing sector organizations to better understand these impacts and put in place an improved framework for community housing providers once their original obligations end.
